	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לְאִשֶּׁה לְמִעַן יִיךְשׁוֹּ בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל אָישׁ נָחַלֶּת אֲבֹתֵיו
ESV	And every daughter who possesses an inheritance in any tribe of the people of Israel shall be wife to one of the clan of the tribe of her father, so that every one of the people of Israel may possess the inheritance of his fathers.
NIV	Every daughter who inherits land in any Israelite tribe must marry someone in her father's tribal clan, so that every Israelite will possess the inheritance of his fathers.
NLT	The daughters throughout the tribes of Israel who are in line to inherit property must marry within their tribe, so that all the Israelites will keep their ancestral property.

Usage in the New Testament

The sense of  $\pi\alpha\zeta$  depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
