Hebrew	hebrew The Hebrew את word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article ה. Genesis 1:1 מְחַנִּיחֵם אֲשֶׁר אֲנִי שֹׂכֵן בְּתוֹכָם
ESV	You shall put out both male and female, putting them outside the camp, that they may not defile their camp, in the midst of which I dwell.”
NIV	Send away male and female alike; send them outside the camp so they will not defile their camp, where I dwell among them.”
NLT	This command applies to men and women alike. Remove them so they will not defile the camp in which I live among them.”

It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἐγὼ καταγίνομαι ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. αὐτοῖς greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive).
