The Hebrew **אֶת** word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article **הַ**. Genesis 1:1 **בְּרָךְ אֱלֹהִים אֶת הַמַּיִם וְאֶת הָאָרֶץ** plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

Verb, appearing approximately 330 times in the Old Testament.
