	The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לֵי חַלְוִיֶּם
ESV	"Thus you shall separate the Levites from among the people of Israel, and the Levites shall be mine.
NIV	In this way you are to set the Levites apart from the other Israelites, and the Levites will be mine.
