

Proverbs 10:19

Hebrew	בְּרֹב דְּבָרִים לֹא יִחְסֹר עֲוֹן וְשֹׁחַץ רַב יִשְׁחָט מִשְׁפָּט
ESV	When words are many, transgression is not lacking, but whoever restrains his lips is prudent.
NIV	When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise.
NLT	Too much talk leads to sin. Be sensible and keep your mouth shut.
LXX	ἐκ πολυλογίας οὐκ ἐκφεύξη ἁμαρτίαν φειδόμενος δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. χειλέων νοήμων ἔση greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g.
KJV	In the multitude of words there wanteth not sin: but he that refraineth his lips is wise.

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
