Hebrew	כַּשְׁחֹק לְכַסִּיל עֲשׂוֹת זִמָּה וְחָכְמָה לְאִישׁ תְּבוּנָה
ESV	Doing wrong is like a joke to a fool, but wisdom is pleasure to a man of understanding.
NIV	A fool finds pleasure in evil conduct, but a man of understanding delights in wisdom.
NLT	Doing wrong is fun for a fool, but living wisely brings pleasure to the sensible.
LXX	ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. γέλῳτι ἄφρων πράσσει κακά ἢ greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Forms Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ δέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. σοφία ἀνδρὶ τίκτει φρόνησιν
KJV	It is as sport to a fool to do mischief: but a man of understanding hath wisdom.
