

Proverbs 11:15

Hebrew	רַע יִרְוַע כִּי עָרַב זָר וְשָׂא תְקַעִים בּוֹטָח
ESV	Whoever puts up security for a stranger will surely suffer harm, but he who hates striking hands in pledge is secure.
NIV	He who puts up security for another will surely suffer, but whoever refuses to strike hands in pledge is safe.
NLT	There's danger in putting up security for a stranger's debt; it's safer not to guarantee another person's debt.
LXX	πονηρὸς κακοποιεῖ ὅταν συμμείξῃ δικάῳ μισεῖ δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἦχον ἀσφαλείας
KJV	He that is surety for a stranger shall smart for it: and he that hateth suretiship is sure.

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
