Hebrew	לבב plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big לבב hebrew Meaning: * The heart * Used figuratively for the feelings, the will and even the intellect * The centre of anything Noun, masculine (although conceptually neutral, being used for both men and women). ESV	Anxiety in a man's heart weighs him down, but a good word makes him glad.
NIV	An anxious heart weighs a man down, but a kind word cheers him up.
NLT	Worry weighs a person down; an encouraging word cheers a person up.
LXX	φοβερὸς λόγος plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big λόγος Meaning * A word or words * Statement * Message * Speech * Account * Used in John to mean God the Son Masculine noun. Related to the verb λέγω. λόγος in Greek Thought Before the New Testament, λόγος already had deep philosophical use. In Greek philosophy, λόγος was the rational principle that ordered the universe, the divine reason that structured all things. In Heraclitus, λόγος referred to the unifying rational principle behind the constant change in the world.... καρδίαν ταρασσει ἀνδρὸς δικαίου ἀγγελία δέ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big δέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἀγαθὴ εὐφραίνει αὐτόν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big αὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English)
KJV	Heaviness in the heart of man maketh it stoop: but a good word maketh it glad.
