Hebrew	מִפְרֵי פִי אִישׁ יֵאָכֵל טוֹב וְנַפְשׁ בְּגֵדִים הָמָס
ESV	From the fruit of his mouth a man eats what is good, but the desire of the treacherous is for violence.
NIV	From the fruit of his lips a man enjoys good things, but the unfaithful have a craving for violence.
NLT	Wise words will win you a good meal, but treacherous people have an appetite for violence.
LXX	ἀπὸ καρπῶν δικαιοσύνης φάγεται ἀγαθός ψυχὰὶ δὲ δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. παρανόμων ὀλοῦνται ἄωροι
KJV	A man shall eat good by the fruit of his mouth: but the soul of the transgressors shall eat violence.

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
