Hebrew	חִכְמַת עֲרוּם הִבִּין דְּרָכּוֹ וְאִלּוּת כְּסִילִים מְרַמֶּה
ESV	The wisdom of the prudent is to discern his way, but the folly of fools is deceiving.
NIV	The wisdom of the prudent is to give thought to their ways, but the folly of fools is deception.
NLT	The prudent understand where they are going, but fools deceive themselves.
LXX	σοφία πανούργων ἐπιγνώσεται τὰς greek The definite article ὁδοὺς αὐτῶν greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ἄνθρα δέ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἀφρόνων ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. πλάνη
KJV	The wisdom of the prudent is to understand his way: but the folly of fools is deceit.

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
