

Proverbs 16:10

Hebrew	קִסְפוֹ עַל פִּי־מֶלֶךְ יִשְׁפָּט כִּי־לֹא יִשְׁגֹּג לִפְיוֹ
ESV	An oracle is on the lips of a king; his mouth does not sin in judgment.
NIV	The lips of a king speak as an oracle, and his mouth should not betray justice.
NLT	The king speaks with divine wisdom; he must never judge unfairly.
LXX	μαντεῖον ἐπὶ χεῖλεσιν βασιλέως ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. κρίσει οὐ μὴ πλανηθῇ τὸ greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Forms Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ τὸ στόμα αὐτοῦ greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). KJV	A divine sentence is in the lips of the king: his mouth transgresseth not in judgment.

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
