Hebrew	זָבַח רָשָׁעִים תּוֹעֵבָה אֵף כִּי בְזָמָה יְבִיאָנּוּ
ESV	The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination; how much more when he brings it with evil intent.
NIV	The sacrifice of the wicked is detestable- how much more so when brought with evil intent!
NLT	The sacrifice of an evil person is detestable, especially when it is offered with wrong motives.
LXX	θυσίαι ἀσεβῶν βδέλυγμα κυρίῳ καὶ αὐτός greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" γὰρ παρανόμως προσφέρουσιν αὐτάς αὐτός greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English)
