	הִתְהַיֵּאָ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The word הִתְהַיֵּאָ means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לְמַדּוּ בְּשֹׁרֵי בְּזִלְזָלִי בָּשָׂר׃
ESV	Be not among drunkards or among gluttonous eaters of meat,
NIV	Do not join those who drink too much wine or gorge themselves on meat,
NLT	Do not carouse with drunkards or feast with gluttons,
LXX	μὴ ἴσθι plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. οἶνοπότης μὴδὲ ἐκτείνου συμβολαῖς κρεῶν τε ἀγορασμοῖς
