Hebrew	אֵל תִּלְחֶם אִתּוֹ hebrew The Hebrew אֵל word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ. Genesis 1:1 לָחֶם רָע עֵינַי וְאֵל תִּתְּאוּ אֶת־אֲיוֹ לְמִטְעָמָיו
	ESV Do not eat the bread of a man who is stingy; do not desire his delicacies,
	NIV Do not eat the food of a stingy man, do not crave his delicacies;
