	הִיָּהָּ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big hebrew The word הִיָּהָּ means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 עד חֲנֹם בְּרַעַד וְהַפְתִּיתָ בְּשִׁפְתֶּיךָ
ESV	Be not a witness against your neighbor without cause, and do not deceive with your lips.
NIV	Do not testify against your neighbor without cause, or use your lips to deceive.
NLT	Don't testify against your neighbors without cause; don't lie about them.
	μὴ ἴσθι plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ψευδὴς μάρτυς ἐπὶ σὸν πολίτην μηδὲ πλατύνου σοῖς χεῖλεσιν
KJV	Be not a witness against thy neighbour without cause; and deceive not with thy lips.

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
