ESV	the locusts have no king, yet all of them march in rank;
NIV	locusts have no king, yet they advance together in ranks;
NLT	Locusts- they have no king, but they march in formation.
LXX	ἀβασίλευτόν ἐστίν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐκστρατεύει ἀφ’ ἐνὸς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἷς gree Meaning: * One * First * One thing * Alone * Individual * One ma * Someone εἷς is the cardinal number (“one”). Sometimes it functions as a indefinitely pronoun (“someone” or “a certain one”). It agrees in gender, number and case with the noun it modifies. Occurs a little under 350 times in the New Testament.
