Hebrew	בְּלִכְתְּךָ לֹא יִצָּר צִעְדְּךָ וְאִם תָּרוּץ לֹא תִכָּשָׁל
ESV	When you walk, your step will not be hampered, and if you run, you will not stumble.
NIV	When you walk, your steps will not be hampered; when you run, you will not stumble.
NLT	When you walk, you won't be held back; when you run, you won't stumble.
LXX	ἐὰν γὰρ πορεύῃ οὐ συγκλίσθησεται σου τὰ πόδια greek The definite article διαβήματα ἐὰν δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. τρέχῃς οὐ κοπιᾷσεις
KJV	When thou goest, thy steps shall not be straitened; and when thou runnest, thou shalt not stumble.
