	hebrew
	The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 בָּרַךְ בְּרִיךְ
	Meaning
ESV	* To kneel * To bless God as an act of adoration * To bless man as a benefit * Sometimes, to curse
	Verb, appearing approximately 330 times in the Old Testament.
	The word בָּרַךְ marks important moments of covenant, worship, inheritance and hope.Genesis 1:28Psalm 103:1Numbers 6:24 וְשָׂמַח מִמַּאֲשֵׁת נְעוּרָיָהּ
NIV	Let your fountain be blessed, and rejoice in the wife of your youth,
NLT	May your fountain be blessed, and may you rejoice in the wife of your youth.
NLT	Let your wife be a fountain of blessing for you. Rejoice in the wife of your youth.

	greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. σοι ἰδίᾳ καὶplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί
	greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences.
