Meaning:

* Wind * Breath * Spirit

Noun. Occurs about 380 times in the Old Testament.

Though usually feminine, רוּחַ sometimes takes masculine verbs and adjectives, especially when referring to the Spirit of God (רוּחַ יְהוָה). Exodus 10:13 Genesis 6:17 Genesis 41:8 Proverbs

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Meaning:

* To create * To cut down, select, feed

Bara is a verb that is never takes a human subject; God is always the one who creates in the Old Testament. In contrast, עָשָׂה (to make or do) and יָצַר (to form and to build) do often have humans as the subject. הָדַשׁ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big הָדַשׁ

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Meanings

* Renew * Restore * Repair

Verb. Occurs 10 times in the Old Testament.

See also הָדַשׁ (Strong's H2319) - meaning "new" - the noun / adjective form.

Examples
