This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.

* Yahweh - God's personal name

lt is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word יְהוָה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

The word אָרֵץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.

When coupled with heavens (שַּׁמֵים), the phrase indicates the entire created order.Genesis 12:1 אָבָרֶם

NIV May their sins always remain before the LORD, that he may cut off the memory of them from the earth.

NLT May the LORD always remember these sins, and may his name disappear from human memory.

The sense of $\pi\alpha$ depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

Meaning:

* Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5)

Feminine noun. Connected to the English words "ground", "geometry" and "geology".

It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 τὸρlugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_ bigò, ἡ, τό
