	הָיָה hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לִי הָיָה בְּבֵית מִגְוָרִי
ESV	Your statutes have been my songs in the house of my sojourning.
NIV	Your decrees are the theme of my song wherever I lodge.
NLT	Your decrees have been the theme of my songs wherever I have lived.
LXX	εἶμι greek εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. οἱ τὰ greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Forms Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ δικαιοσύματά σου ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. τόπῳ παροικίας μου
