Hebrew	בְּאוּרֵי רַחֲמֶיךָ וְאַחֲיָה כִּי תוֹרַתְךָ שְׂעִשְׁעֵי
ESV	Let your mercy come to me, that I may live; for your law is my delight.
NIV	Let your compassion come to me that I may live, for your law is my delight.
NLT	Surround me with your tender mercies so I may live, for your instructions are my delight.
LXX	ἐλθέτωσάν μοι οἱ greek The definite article οἱ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” greek The definite article νόμος σου μελέτη μου ἐστίν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g.
