The Hebrew [אתָּ](#) word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article [הַ](#). Genesis 1:1 [לְשֹׁמֵר אֶרֶץ](#) [plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big](#) Examples

The verb [שָׁמַר](#) occurs about 470 times in the Old Testament.
