	יהוה אֱמַרְתָּ לַיהוה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigיהוה hebrew Meaning * Yahweh - God's personal name Hebrew It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word יהוה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament. ESV	I say to the LORD, “You are my Lord; I have no good apart from you.”
NIV	I said to the LORD, “You are my Lord; apart from you I have no good thing.”

LXX	εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
