Meaning:

* To be light * To shine * To give light * To illuminate

Verb occurring around 20 times in the Old Testament. It is sometimes used literally, and, at other times, figuratively.

Biblical Examples

Intransitive sense

Used when light itself shines or dawns. Isaiah 60:1 Exodus 13:21 אֶתֶּה תֵּאִיר־plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big אֶתֶּה תֵּאִיר

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Meaning

* Yahweh - God's personal name

It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word אֶתֶּה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

First appearing in Genesis 2:4, it occurs over 6,000 times in the Old Testament.
