	ἐνέκα τοῦ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὀ greek The definite article ὀνόματός σου κύριε καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἰλάση τῇ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὀ greek The definite article ἁμαρτίᾳ μου πολλὴ γὰρ ἐστὶν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g.
