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| LXX | <p>γνώρισόν μοι κύριε τὸν</p> <p>greek</p> <p>The definite article <a href="#">πέρας μου καὶ</a></p> <p>greek</p> <p>Meaning</p> <p>* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So</p> <p>Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” <a href="#">τὸν</a></p> |

|     | <p>The definite article <a href="#">ἡμερῶν μου τίς ἐστιν</a></p> <p>greek</p> <p>εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).</p>                                                                                                                                      |
|     | <p>It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. <a href="#">ἵνα γνῶ τί ὑστερῶ ἐγώ</a></p>                                                                                                            |
