Hebrew	אֲרֶצְךָ מִשְׁכַּנְּךָ מִלְחָמוֹת עַד קֶצֶה הָאָרֶץ hebrew Meaning: * Earth (e.g. Genesis 1:1) or world * Land * Countries or country The word אֲרֶץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground. When coupled with heavens (שָׁמַיִם), the phrase indicates the entire created order. Genesis 12:1 קִשְׁתַּי יִשְׁבֵּר וְקִצְצִי חֲנִית עֲגֻלוֹת יִשְׂרָאֵל בְּאֵשׁ
ESV	"Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!"
NIV	"Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth."
NLT	"Be still, and know that I am God! I will be honored by every nation. I will be honored throughout the world."

LXX	αχολάσατε καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” γνώτε ὅτι ἐγὼ εἰμι plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ὁ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article θεός plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigθεός greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God ὕψωθήσομαι ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. τοῖς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article ἔθνεσιν ὕψωθήσομαι ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. τῇ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article γῇ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigγῇ Meaning: * Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5) Feminine noun. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”. It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1
