It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἀπώσω κἀplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκἀ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences.
