	Masculine noun. The word is dual in form (ending in -ים) which normally indicates two things (like eyes and hands), however, however it functions as a plural. 	* Earth (e.g. Genesis 1:1) or world * Land * Countries or country
	The word אֶרֶץ can designate the whole of planet earth, or the inhabitable world or the national territory or ground.
	When coupled with heavens (שָׁמַיִם), the phrase indicates the entire created order.Genesis 12:1 יִרְעִם הָיִם וּמִלְאֵוּ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big
ESV	Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all that fills it;
NIV	Let the heavens rejoice, let the earth be glad; let the sea resound, and all that is in it;
NLT	Let the heavens be glad, and the earth rejoice! Let the sea and everything in it shout his praise!

	ἐὐφραινέσθωσαν οἱ greek The definite article οὐρανοί Meaning: * The sky * Air * Heaven or heavens 278 occurrences in the New Testament. Οὐρανός is used in Scripture to describe the sky and universe (that is, the visible expanse above the earth) as well as the transcendent realm where God is present. For example, in Matthew 6:26Matthew 24:29Matthew 6:9 καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἀγαλλιάσθω ἢ greek The definite article γῆ Meaning: * Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5) Feminine noun. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”. It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 σαλευθήτω ἡ greek The definite article θάλασσα καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” τὸ greek The definite article πλήρωμα αὐτῆς
