	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἦ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ὁ, ἡ, τό

NIV	Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the second death.
NLT	Then death and the grave were thrown into the lake of fire. This lake of fire is the second death.
KJV	And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death.

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
