Preposition meaning “in”. οἷς ἐστε plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί

greek

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big καί

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ὑμεῖς κλητοὶ Ἰησοῦ Χριστοῦ, plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big Χριστός

Christ means “anointed one”

The equivalent Hebrew word is Messiah (מָשִׁיחַ)
