	καθάπερ γέγραπται, ἔδωκεν αὐτοῖς greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ὁ greek The definite article θεὸς greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God πνεῦμα κατανύξεως, ὀφθαλμοὺς τοῦ greek The definite article μὴ βλέπειν καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ὡτα τοῦ greek The definite article μὴ ἀκούειν, ἕως τῆς greek The definite article σήμερον ἡμέρας.
ESV	as it is written, “God gave them a spirit of stupor, eyes that would not see and ears that would not hear, down to this very day.”
NIV	as it is written: “God gave them a spirit of stupor, eyes so that they could not see and ears so that they could not hear, to this very day.”
NLT	As the Scriptures say, “God has put them into a deep sleep. To this day he has shut their eyes so they do not see, and closed their ears so they do not hear.”
KJV	According as it is written, God hath given them the spirit of slumber, eyes that they should not see, and ears that they should not hear;) unto this day.

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
