Greek	Οὐ γὰρ ἐστὶν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. προσωποληψία παρὰ τῷ greek
	The definite article θεῷ. greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God
	ESV For God shows no partiality.
	NIV For God does not show favoritism.
	NLT For God does not show favoritism.
KJV	For there is no respect of persons with God.

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
