

Romans 2:19

Greek	πέποιθάς τε σεαυτὸν ὁδηγὸν εἶναι greek εἶμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τυφλῶν, φῶς τῶν greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Forms Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. σκότει,
