It most frequently takes the accusative case, but at times it takes the genitive or dative cases, giving it a different meaning again. εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It is an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. **αὐτὸν** **αὐτός**

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” **δικαιοῦντα τὸν**
