	Adverb or preposition (taking the genitive case) that expressing exclusion or lack of association between two things. Occurs 41 times in the New Testament.
	Biblical Examples John 15:5Hebrews 9:22James 2:26Matthew 13:34 ἔργων νόμου .
ESV	For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.
NIV	For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from observing the law.
NLT	So we are made right with God through faith and not by obeying the law.
KJV	Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith without the deeds of the law.

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
