	The definite article θάνατος ἀπὸ Ἀδὰμ μέχρι Μωϋσέως καὶ
	greek
	Meaning
	* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So
	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐπὶ τοὺς
	greek
	The definite article μὴ ἀμαρτήσαντας ἐπὶ τῷ
	greek
Greek	The definite article ὁμοιώματι τῆς
	greek
	The definite article παραβάσεως Ἀδάμ, ὃς ἐστίν
	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τύπος τοῦ
	greek
	The definite article μέλλοντος.
ESV	Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one who was to come.
NIV	Nevertheless, death reigned from the time of Adam to the time of Moses, even over those who did not sin by breaking a command, as did Adam, who was a pattern of the one to come.
NLT	Still, everyone died- from the time of Adam to the time of Moses- even those who did not disobey an explicit commandment of God, as Adam did. Now Adam is a symbol, a representation of Christ, who was yet to come.
KJV	Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the figure of him that was to come.
