When used with the genitive case, διὰ emphasizes the means or channel by which something happens. Usage in the New Testament The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable. Occurs 41 times in the New Testament. Biblical Examples John 15:5 Hebrews 9:22 James 2:26 Matthew 13:34 γὰρ νόμου ἀμαρτία νεκρά.

ESV	But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. Apart from the law, sin lies dead.
NIV	But sin, seizing the opportunity afforded by the commandment, produced in me every kind of covetous desire. For apart from law, sin is dead.
NLT	But sin used this command to arouse all kinds of covetous desires within me! If there were no law, sin would not have that power.
KJV	But sin, taking occasion by the commandment, wrought in me all manner of concupiscence. For without the law sin was dead.
