Greek	Ἄρα οὖν, ἀδελφοί, ὀφειλέται ἐσμέν,plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. οὐ τῇplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article σαρκὶ τοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article κατὰ σάρκα ζῆν.
