	ὁ greek The definite article ὁ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἑρπυσσῶν τὰς greek The definite article καρδίας οἶδεν τί τὸ greek The definite article φρόνημα τοῦ greek The definite article πνεύματος, ὅτι κατὰ θεὸν greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God ἐντυγχάνει ὑπὲρ ἁγίων.
ESV	And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.
NIV	And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God's will.
NLT	And the Father who knows all hearts knows what the Spirit is saying, for the Spirit pleads for us believers in harmony with God's own will.
KJV	And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.

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
