Before the New Testament, $\lambda \acute{o} \gamma o \varsigma$ already had deep philosophical use. In Greek philosophy, $\lambda \acute{o} \gamma o \varsigma$ was the rational principle that ordered the universe, the divine reason that structured all things. The sense of $\pi \tilde{\alpha} \varsigma$ depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
