	* Not * Nor * Neither * Not even	
Greek	A combination of the words οὐ (meaning no) and δέ (meaning however or but). The word οὐδέ adds another negative element to a sentence that already has one. οὐδέ can join words, phrases, or whole clauses. It often functions like English Matthew 6:20John 7:5Romans 3:10 ὅτι εἰς	
	greek	
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).	
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. σπέρμα Ἀβραάμ, πάντες

Greek	Usage in the New Testament	
	The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.	
	With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 τέκνα, ἀλλ', ἐν	
	Preposition meaning “in”. Ἰσαὰκ κληθήσεταιί σοι σπέρμα.	
ESV	and not all are children of Abraham because they are his offspring, but “Through Isaac shall your offspring be named.”	
NIV	Nor because they are his descendants are they all Abraham's children. On the contrary, “It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned.”	
NLT	Being descendants of Abraham doesn't make them truly Abraham's children. For the Scriptures say, “Isaac is the son through whom your descendants will be counted,” though Abraham had other children, too.	
KJV	Neither, because they are the seed of Abraham, are they all children: but, In Isaac shall thy seed be called.
