Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” εἶπεν Βοος τῷplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

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The definite article ἀγχιστεῖ τὴνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

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The definite article μερίδα τοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

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The definite article ἀγροῦ ἢ ἐστὶνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί

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εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ
