ESV	Your teeth are like a flock of shorn ewes that have come up from the washing, all of which bear twins, and not one among them has lost its young.
NIV	Your teeth are like a flock of sheep just shorn, coming up from the washing. Each has its twin; not one of them is alone.
NLT	Your teeth are as white as sheep, recently shorn and freshly washed. Your smile is flawless, each tooth matched with its twin.

Usage in the New Testament The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἄτεκνοῦσα οὐκ ἔστιν greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. οὐταῖς greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive).
