Usage in the New Testament	The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
	With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 εὐαρέστους
	εἶναι,plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἶμι
	greek
	εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. μὴ ἀντιλέγοντας,
ESV	Slaves are to be submissive to their own masters in everything; they are to be well-pleasing, not argumentative,
NIV	Teach slaves to be subject to their masters in everything, to try to please them, not to talk back to them,
NLT	Slaves must always obey their masters and do their best to please them. They must not talk back
KJV	Exhort servants to be obedient unto their own masters, and to please them well in all things; not answering again;

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
