	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and”

	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
ESV	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. αὐτοκατάκριτος.
	knowing that such a person is warped and sinful; he is self-condemned.
	NIV
	You may be sure that such a man is warped and sinful; he is self-condemned.
	NLT
	For people like that have turned away from the truth, and their own sins condemn them.
KJV	Knowing that he that is such is subverted, and sinneth, being condemned of himself.

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
