In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בְּרֵא אֱלֹהִים (עֲיִנִי וְכָל סוֹס הָעַמִּים אֶבֶר בְּעֶרְוֹן

	δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. τὸν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ
