Hebrew	The word הִיְהִי means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לִמְעַן שֶׁעַר אֲדָרֶת שַׁעַר לְמַעַן בְּיוֹם הַהוּא יִכְשׂוּ הַנְּבִיאִים אִישׁ מִחֻזְיוֹ בְּהַנְבִּאתוֹ וְלֹא יִלְבָּשׂוּ אֲדָרֶת שַׁעַר לְמַעַן

IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐσται greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
